\$1000 KENJINKAI SCHOLARSHIP

We are offering a \$1000 scholarship to a qualified high school student who submits a complete application by April 30th, 2023 deadline. The successful applicant will be a senior who shows the most potential in helping us meet our goals of preserving the culture and traditions of Okinawa. Starting this year, an additional requirement will be to satisfy a minimum of 8 hours of community service which includes assisting the Kenjinkai with a variety of tasks at our annual events. A Community Service form is available on our website.

Applicants should be current high school seniors accepted to an undergraduate program at an accredited college or university. Students attending the first year of college will be considered only if there are no qualified high school seniors.
